

First Smiles - FAQ

Improving oral health for children everywhere

What is First Smiles?

First Smiles is an initiative created by the British Society of Dental Hygiene & Therapy in order to teach young school children in the UK some of the basic oral health and hygiene messages.



How does First Smiles work?

First Smiles asks you to identify nurseries or schools nearby that you and your practice can visit.

By making contact with them and asking whether they would be open to you giving a talk or interactive lesson in the classroom.

When is First Smiles?

First Smiles takes place on **12 June 2020**. This is when we want you, our supporters, to go into nurseries and schools to deliver oral health education.

Why is it important?

Nearly one in three children in the UK are starting school with visible signs of tooth decay. In primary schools around eight or nine children in every class will have already developed tooth decay – that's approaching a quarter of a million children in each primary school year and around 3.3 million young people aged 0-14 years.

What do I do to take part?

Firstly, speak with your team. Discuss whether you can commit yourself to working out of the Practice on that day. Identify a nearby school and get in contact with them. Confirm a date and time, along with some of the things you will be teaching the children. Use free resources like the ones on [Dental Buddy](#) to help you deliver the lessons. What if my nursery or school is unavailable on 14 June?

Don't worry. Arrange the visit for whenever is good for the school. Remember that it's [National Smile Month](#) between 18 May and 18 June so this would also be a perfect time to organise your visit!

What can I do in my lesson?

Anything that is informative but also enjoyable and fun for the children. Toothbrushing demonstrations and guidance and tuition about brushing are always received positively. Other topics such as what our mouths and teeth are for, along with diet and sugar in foods and drinks also go down well. Be sure to make the messages basic and easy-to-understand. Do them as games, quizzes and competitions for maximum engagement.
